

The children also receive regular group and individual therapies from master's degree social work staff and recreational therapists. They attend a special needs classroom staffed by EVSC teachers and assistants. In 2008, an occupational therapist was added to provide special sensory programming for the children. The Center has a full-time board certified child psychiatrist, a psychologist on contract to take care of all testing needs, and an art therapist (3 to 5 hours weekly). The occupational therapy program added in 2008 added several options to the program, such as comfort rooms, sensory boxes, sensory cabinets for each dorm, and a morning program before school called Minds in Motion (which improves sensory integration and facilitates a more successful day in the classroom).

The Center also has videoconferencing available for parents or other and treatment partners to be able to make contact with the team at the Center and with the child and family therapy which is an important component of the treatment plan.

Referrals are made to the program through the local mental health center and requires psychological IQ testing, psychiatric assessment, and CANS testing. Referrals are reviewed within 48 hours of receipt and, if all information has been received, an admission date can be set within two weeks (if a bed is available). EPCC is known for their comprehensive evaluations, excellent and committed specialty treatment for children who have experienced trauma, reducing and simplifying psychotropic medications, taking care of the whole person (resulting in significant reductions in BMI and resolution of dyslipidemias), and the importance of parent/guardian involvement, and coordination with community supports.
